SMALL WORKS PROJECT REQUEST FOR QUOTES 2025 RESERVOIR DIVING

PURPOSE

Public Utility District No. 1 of Skagit County (Skagit PUD) requests quotes for the 2025 Reservoir Diving.

SCOPE OF WORK

Skagit PUD solicits a qualified contractor to perform 2025 diving and cleaning on five (5) reservoirs. We have attached addresses to each site, along with the tank sizes and makeup of the reservoir material.

An interior video inspection will be completed with real-time closed-circuit high-resolution color underwater video equipment. All pertinent findings will be recorded in DVD format or electronic recordings (including the dive maintenance technician's findings and narrative summary) and on all checklists and written recommendations. The exterior reservoir report will note exterior inspection findings/color photographs.

Video record, hardcopy written report, and summary of recommendations will be provided upon completion of the operations and will remain the property of the customer. A complete inspection will include the following criteria:

1. A visual inspection of the reservoir's interior and exterior.
2. Immediately after the inspection, the customer representative received a verbal report of the reservoir's condition.
3. An Inspection report with the following information:
 - a) Nameplate Information.
 - b) Findings pertaining to the condition of internal components (i.e., plumbing, vents, hatches, Cathodic system, etc.).
 - c) Numeric representation of the percent of corrosion and/or damaged areas.
 - d) A Color video illustrating each type of coating failure, the general condition of the coating, and the substrate. The video shall be clear, sharp, and definitive (an interior video based on the clarity of the water in a reservoir).
 - e) A report on coating failure analysis and the probable causes.
 - f) Report on pit depth and metal loss based on ASTM G 46-94 Standard Guide for Examination and Evaluation of Pitting Corrosion, measured in millimeters at significant corrosion modulation sites. Also, the calculated rate of metal loss and the theoretical penetration rate (if applicable).
 - g) If applicable, a sample specification for repair or recoating of the interior and exterior.
 - h) Report referencing the various coating defects and causes reported.
4. A video of the general condition of the interior surfaces. The video shall be narrated regarding the location of internal components, and pertinent findings will be noted.
5. Removal of silt from floors utilizing underwater methods.
6. A report on the thickness and type of silt on the reservoir floor.
 - ✓ All Dive Maintenance Technicians and associated in-tank equipment are thoroughly disinfected according to AWWA Standard C652-92.
 - ✓ All Diving Services operations pertaining to Diving and Confined Space conducted on the Skagit system are in compliance with all applicable.

QUALIFICATIONS

Quotes will be received by contractors solicited by Skagit PUD. Successful contractor must have a current certificate of registration as a contractor in compliance with chapter 18.27 RCW, which must have been in effect at the time of quote submittal and have a current Washington Unified Business Identifier (UBI) number.

PREVAILING WAGES, INSURANCE, AND BONDING

Contractor is required to pay prevailing wage in accordance with RCW 39.12, including submittal of intent and affidavit forms to Skagit PUD. Prevailing wage information can be found at www.lni.wa.gov. Contractor is required to submit a certificate of insurance showing Skagit PUD as the certificate holder and additional insured with respect to the Project, and with minimum amounts as indicated on the enclosed example.

The successful bidder will be required to provide Skagit PUD 5% retainage along with an executed payment and performance bond for the full Contract amount or opt for a 10% retainage in lieu of bond.

CONTRACT

Upon award, Skagit PUD and the selected contractor will execute Skagit PUD's standard contract for the work as indicated on the enclosed example.

WHEREAS, the District has caused the preparation of certain Contract Documents entitled

WHEREAS, the District has invited proposals, has received and analyzed said proposals, and has duly given notice of Acceptance of Proposal to the Vendor which are made a part hereof and which constitute the whole Contract between the District and the Vendor.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed that:

1. The Vendor shall furnish the work, pay all costs, and perform all requirements of this Contract in the manner specified in the documents referenced above, and;
2. The Bid or Proposal calls for unit prices and lump sums, or time and material pricing if required, as set forth in #1 above. Vendor will not exceed price without District written approval. The District shall pay to the Vendor a corrected total contract amount computed from the unit prices and lump sums in said Bid or Proposal and the actual quantities of units furnished. Based upon the lump sum and unit prices in said Bid or Proposal, and upon the quantities estimated from the Contract Drawings for bidding purposes, the estimated Total Contract Amount is

3. In Washington State, the District is required to pay state or local sales or use taxes included in the Total Contract Amount and the Vendor is required to receive the said taxes for payment to the state, the amount payable to the Vendor by the Owner shall be the Total Contract Amount as above specified including the amount of the said taxes. Invoices will be paid by the District to the Vendor within 30 days of receipt based on actual quantities of work performed, and;
4. It is further agreed that the Vendor will start work within ten (10) calendar days after the date specified in the District's Notice to Proceed and shall be substantially complete within _____ days from the date of Notice to Proceed is issued, and;
5. The attached Indemnification Agreement is hereby made part of this Contract, and;
6. In the event that the Vendor fails to substantially complete the Project by the date of substantial completion as specified above or as modified by Change Order, the Vendor shall be liable for liquidated damages of

INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT

The Vendor agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold the District harmless from any and all claims, demands, losses, and liabilities to or by third parties arising from, resulting from, or connected with work performed or to be performed under this Contract by the Vendor, its agents, employees, and subconsultants, even though such claims may prove to be false, groundless, or fraudulent, to the fullest extent permitted by law and subject to the limitations provided below.

The Vendor's duty to indemnify the District shall not apply to liability for damages arising out of bodily injury to persons or damage to property caused by or resulting from the sole negligence of the District or the District's agents or employees. The Vendor's duty to indemnify the District for liability for damages arising out of bodily injury to persons or damage to property caused by or resulting from the concurrent negligence of Vendor, its agents, employees, or subconsultants and/or the District or the District's agents or employees, shall apply only to the extent of negligence of Vendor, its agents, employees, or subconsultants.

With respect to claims against Vendor by the District pursuant to this Contract only, Vendor expressly waives any immunity that may be granted it under the Workers' Compensation, Industrial Insurance or like statutes and/or any administrative regulations issued pursuant thereto. This waiver does not include or extend to any claims by Vendor's employees directly against Vendor.

Further, Vendor's defense and indemnification obligations under this Contract shall not be limited in any way by any limitation on the amount or type of damages, compensation or benefits payable to or for any third party under Workers' Compensation, Industrial Insurance or like statutes and/or any administrative regulations issued pursuant thereto.

Vendor 's duty to indemnify the District for liabilities or losses, other than for bodily injury to persons or damage to property caused by or resulting from negligence, shall apply only to the extent of the fault of Vendor, its agents, employees, or subconsultants, except in situations where fault is not a requirement for liability, in which case indemnity will be provided to the extent the liability or loss was caused by Vendor or its agents, employees, or subconsultants.

Vendor's duty to defend, indemnify and hold the District harmless shall include, as to all claims, demands, losses and liabilities to which it applies, the District's actual attorneys' fees and costs incurred in connection with defending such claim(s) including, without limitation, consultant and expert witness fees and expenses and personnel-related costs in addition to costs otherwise recoverable by statute or court rule.
